

Exercise 5: Statutory Citations
(due April 11, 2007)

Look up each of the following statutes in order to find any missing citation information, then construct a complete citation to the statute in ALWD form. For Illinois statutes, use the print edition of Illinois Compiled Statutes rather than Lexis or Westlaw; you may substitute “ILCS” for “Ill. Comp. Stat.” if you wish. For federal statutes, cite to the official edition of the United States Code.

1. Subsection (c) of section 20 of the Environmental Protection Act, an Illinois statute enacted in 1970. Section 20 has been amended several times, most recently in 1993. Include the name of the act in the citation, as permitted by ALWD Rule 14.2(g).
2. The Economic Espionage Act of 1996, a federal statute that appears in title 18 of the United States Code. Cite to subdivision (a) of the first section of the act, and include the name of the act in the citation.

3. The Anticybersquatting Consumer Protection Act, enacted by Congress in 1999 and codified at 15 U.S.C. § 1125(d).
4. Section 4 of the Child Passenger Protection Act, as amended by the Illinois General Assembly in 2003.
5. Section 12-610.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, added by the General Assembly in 2005.
