

Exercise 5: Statutory Citations
(due November 9, 2009)

Look up each of the following statutes in order to find any missing citation information, then construct a complete citation to the statute in ALWD form. (For Illinois statutes, you may substitute “ILCS” for “Ill. Comp. Stat.” if you wish.)

1. Subsection (c) of section 20 of the Environmental Protection Act, an Illinois statute enacted in 1970. Section 20 has been amended several times, most recently in 1993. Include the name of the act in the citation, as permitted by ALWD Rule 14.2(g).
2. The Economic Espionage Act of 1996, a federal statute that appears in title 18 of the United States Code. Cite to subdivision (a) of the first section of the act, and include the name of the act in the citation.

3. The Controlling the Assault of Non-Solicited Pornography and Marketing (CAN-SPAM) Act of 2003 regulates the sending of commercial electronic mail messages. The act is codified in title 15 of the United States Code. Cite to section 6(a) of the act, which corresponds to § 7705(a) of title 15.
4. A provision of the Illinois Code of Civil Procedure places limits upon the contingent fees that attorneys may collect for medical malpractice cases. Locate and cite to this provision.
